SUEZ INVESTING \$600,000 IN LOCAL WATER INFRASTRUCTURE

Improvements in Toms River Will Enhance Service Reliability and Water Quality

SUEZ officials announced that work will begin the week of April 1, 2019 on a water infrastructure improvement project within the Township of Toms River to replace 2,400 feet of aging water main. The company's replacement of infrastructure on Bay Breeze Drive, Cattus Street, Longman Street and Sea Breeze Drive is a top priority in providing its residential customers with safe and reliable water service.

"While small water systems across the country often lack the resources needed to maintain reliable service, SUEZ is taking a proactive approach. These upgrades will help ensure that our customers will be served by a system that provides exceptional water quality and will continue to be reliable for many years to come," said Jim Mastrokalos, Director of Operations.

Mastrokalos added that these capital improvements are a continuation of a local \$4.5 million water main upgrade program. SUEZ will replace about 2,400 feet of 8-inch ductile iron water pipe, add two fire hydrants and renew approximately 50 water services through about May 2019, weather permitting. The company will conduct work weekdays from 7 AM through 5 PM and Saturdays from 9 AM through 4 PM.

The company expects brief, temporary, service interruptions while work occurs. Customers will be alerted in advance regarding specific dates and times when temporary water shut offs will occur.

Mastrokalos noted that SUEZ will work with Toms River officials during the Township's own construction project in the same neighborhoods.

Final restoration, including pavement for all of the projects, is expected be completed by June 2019.
